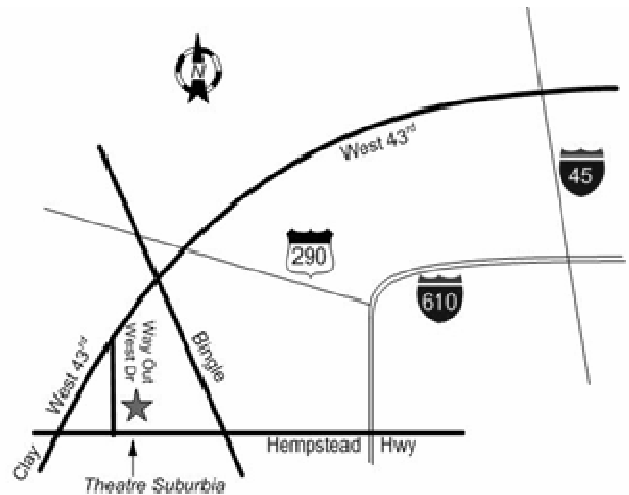
Director Elvin Moriarty will need 9 men and 6 women of various ages.
